Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme opens today


The government's Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme portal launched today with businesses able to claim up to £2,500 a month towards staff wages.

Employers can apply for direct cash grants through HMRC's new online portal with the money expected to land in their bank accounts within six working days.

 Future Fund to be launched; UK businesses driving innovation and development will be helped through the coronavirus outbreak with a £1.25 billion government support package, the Chancellor announced today.

The comprehensive package includes a new £500 million loan scheme for high-growth firms, called the Future Fund, and £750 million of targeted support for small and medium sized businesses focusing on research and development.

Launching in May 2020, the Future Fund will provide government loans to UK-based companies ranging from £125,000 to £5 million, subject to at least equal match funding from private investors.

These convertible loans may be a suitable option for businesses that rely on equity investment and are unable to access the Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme.


